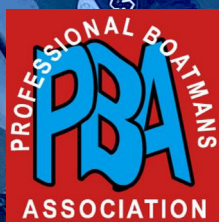

# PRE-TRIP BRIEFING

## CHECKLIST

Before setting out on a trip, you may wish to provide a short briefing to your anglers if they are not familiar with fishing for bluefin specifically. We have provided a short checklist of things we have found it useful to cover.

TOPIC	SPECIFICS	COVERED
<b>SAFETY</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lifejackets, liferafts, life rings, flares, fire extinguishers etc.</li> <li>• <b>BFT are large, very powerful fish, and a real risk of injury to angler, crew, and fish exists.</b></li> <li>• Your safety is our top priority, followed by fish welfare.</li> <li>• <b>It is important that you follow the instructions of the skipper and crewman at all times.</b></li> <li>• You should be honest about your experience and fitness, the skipper may decide to fish with certain gear and techniques depending upon those factors.</li> </ul>	
<b>FISHERY AMBASSADORS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>The battle to win this fishery has been long and hard and we are still under the spotlight.</b></li> <li>• As such we must maintain the highest standards or risk criticisms that could put its future at risk.</li> <li>• <b>Treat these special fish (and the skipper/crew!) with respect and where they may conflict, prioritise the tuna's, wellbeing and survival over your own desires, such as 'the fight experience' and 'great photo's'.</b></li> </ul>	
<b>ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Skipper (ultimate responsibility for the day)-- finds fish, decides tackle/techniques. What they say goes.</li> <li>• <b>Crew – coaching, leadering, lip hooking (and tagging if undertaken).</b></li> <li>• Angler. Be safe. Fight fish, do what skipper/crew says!, (e.g. helping deploy and clear gear), and have fun</li> </ul>	
<b>REGULATIONS AND CODE OF CONDUCT</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>We are subject to the regulations of the fishery and the conditions of our permit. No fish to be removed from the water being the most important one.</b></li> <li>• A Code of Conduct has been designed by experienced skippers to ensure a safe, positive environment for all. Please read this and follow it.</li> </ul>	

TOPIC	SPECIFICS	COVERED
<p><b>DATA COLLECTION</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The recording and reporting of some data is mandatory and a condition of the permit.</li> <li>• <b>Additional data may be collected voluntarily to aid in the understanding of the fishery.</b></li> <li>• Crew/skipper may ask you to help record some of that data during the day.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>FIGHT PREPARATION AND PROTOCOL</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Co-operate with and pay attention to the crew/skipper in any equipment briefing, harness fitting, etc..</li> <li>• <b>You may be assigned a role/roles by the skipper or crew.</b></li> <li>• Unless specifically requested, do not adjust or interfere with any fishing tackle before, during or after the hookup and fight.</li> <li>• <b>If requested, help clear and stow all other lines when a strike occurs.</b></li> <li>• Do not impede or obstruct the skipper/crew communications or line of sight during the fight.</li> <li>• <b>First sight of the fish and leadering are exciting but DANGEROUS- stay calm and out of the way.</b></li> <li>• ONLY an experienced individual assigned by the skipper may leader the fish.</li> <li>• <b>Wait until the fish is called 'secure' by the leaderman before unharnessing, and/or pressing forward for pictures.</b></li> <li>• Accept that the skipper/crew may decide to take the rod from the angler to a crewman/another angler if they think a risk exists to the angler or fish from fatigue, poor technique, failure to follow guidance.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>PHOTOS AND SOCIAL MEDIA</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>We are a highly scrutinised fishery so think carefully about what you film and post online.</b> Ill-considered images or comments could undermine the future of the fishery.</li> <li>• <b>Bloody fish, mortalities (whilst very rare) in particular should not be shared.</b></li> <li>• Skipper has the right to say phones, cameras, videos to be put away where necessary.</li> <li>• <b>There will be opportunities for great pictures of fish in the water boatside with the angler in the shot. Under no circumstances will fish be boarded, (it is a criminal offence under the regulations), and shots of an angler 'in the water' with a fish are dangerous, and should be prohibited.</b></li> </ul>
